More branches result in more flowers per plant and a showier display in the landscape. We noted that the older flowers were nearly the same magenta color as the new flowers; the flowers held their bright coloration very well as they aged. This first year flowering perennial reportedly keeps on blooming without having to be deadheaded, though you may still want to trim back spent flowers to maintain a tidy appearance. Fern Lady

fern Athyrium filix-femina



Native to North America, this deciduous fern is common to moist sites throughout the northern hemisphere. It is characterized by lush, finely textured, medium green fronds with an arching habit. They radiate gracefully out from the center of the crown. New leaves are produced throughout the season for a continually fresh look. At maturity, the stems turn dark red.



Fern Ghost

fern Athyrium 'Ghost'



A hybrid cross between Japanese Painted fern (A. niponicum 'Pictum') and Lady Fern (A. filix-femina), this selection sports stunning frosted apple green fronds that seem to emit a ghostly white light in the shade. Dark purple stems hold the broad fronds rigidly upright. This selection is taller than many other Athyriums and is more tolerant of dry soil.



Giant Japaneese Painted

Fern Athyrium 'Godzilla'



Like Athyrium n. 'Pictum' on steroids, this giant painted fern was discovered at Plant Delights Nursery in the mid-90s and is thought to be a sporeling of 'Pictum' and the Lady Fern. It forms a massive, arching clump of silvery fronds with green highlights and dark purple stems. Like the Lady Fern, 'Godzilla' spreads slowly where it is happiest in moist, loamy soils.

fern Athyrium 'Pictum'



2004 Perennial Plant of the Year! One of the most colorful ferns for the garden, the Japanese Painted Fern has silvery-grey fronds which are dusty purple towards the center. They are set off by the purplish-red veins and stems.

fern Athyrium 'Victoriae'



The pinnae (leaflets) criss-cross up the frond and the tip of each frond is crested. As the tip continues to lengthen all season, it starts to look more and more like fringe with each passing week. The texture is so unique, it is bound to set itself apart from all of the other plants in your shade garden.



Ostrich Fern

fern Matteuccia struthiopteris



One of the largest and most popular ferns in cultivation today. The dark green, pinnate fronds are shaped like ostrich plumes, being much wider at the top and tapering down to a bare stipe. The first set of leaves is sterile and has a gracefully arching form. These leaves can reach heights of 6 feet in ideal environments. This set of leaves dies back by early to midsummer and is replaced by a set of fertile, dark green leaves which are about half the height of the sterile ones. One of the finer ground covers for shade though it is a little taller than some of the traditional ground cover plants. The leaves are shaped like a tiny Lupine leaf and the flowers are tiny and white. Leaves are bright green and have a vanilla fragrance. Good for the rock garden, woodland garden, naturalizing and as a ground cover. Fast growth rate. Will grow in moist soil. Has a spicy aroma and is often sold as a dried herb.

grass Hakonechloa 'All Gold'



One of the most gorgeous of ornamental grasses, also one of the few that prefers shady sites. This makes a dwarf mound of narrow golden-yellow leaves with more of a spiky habit compared to other forms. Tiny green flowers are hidden among the leaves. Slow to grow, but eventually makes a wonderful edging. Combines beautifully with Hostas or ferns, since all have similar requirements. Mature clumps may be divided in early spring, but be sure to make the divisions large for best success. Needs afternoon shade but morning sun brings out the best color.



Ornamental Grass

grass Miscanthus 'Autumn Anthem'



Hybridized and selected for its heavy flower production and perfect habit all season, 'Autumn Anthem' is the epitome of fall blooming Miscanthus. It forms a dense, rounded ball-shaped clump of finely textured, dark green leaves with a narrow, white midrib and is nearly equal in height and spread. Before blooming, the foliage stands about 3 ½' tall. In early to mid-fall, a profusion of feathery, cream colored plumes cover the top 2/3 of the plant. There are plenty to use for cut flowers and dried flower bouquets.



Ornamental Grass

grass Miscanthus 'Encore'



'Encore' is a perfect choice for northern climates, where the growing season is shorter. Since it blooms so early, this ornamental grass has a chance for an encore performance, shooting up a secondary flush of coppery purple plumes before frost hits. Blooming starts in late summer to early fall and lasts until mid-fall. The flowers turn to a creamy tan color with age. This perennial forms a tall, upright clump of dark green leaves with white midribs. Before blooming, this plant stands around 4 1/2' tall. Be sure to leave this grass standing so it can provide winter interest through the snowy months.



Ornamental Grass

grass Miscanthus S 'Oktoberfest'



'Oktoberfest' is the gold standard in Miscanthus. The wide, deep green leaves with a white midrib form a narrowly upright tower about 4 ½' tall before blooming. In late summer or early fall, the foliage develops deep purple and red highlights which complement the showy flowers that emerge a rich shade of shimmering burgundy and copper, then mature into fluffy, creamy tan seed heads. **Deer Resistant**

Bitter Switch Grass

grass Panicum a. 'Apache Rose'



Neither rain nor wind will knock this solid grass down! 'Apache Rose' has a dense, upright, columnar habit with grey-green leaves. In the fall, the tips of the leaves are flushed with a hint of rosy-red. While other greenleaved Switch Grass typically have cream or tan inflorescences, 'Apache Rose' has unique rose-colored flower panicles—a welcome color in the fall garden. Switch grass gets its name from the peaceful swishing sound it makes when blowing in the wind. All parts of this grass are very sturdy, and will remain standing thru winter unless snows are heavy. This provides important cover for birds during the coldest days of winter. This grass is very versitile from a design standpoint; it is effective as a specimen, in masses, for screening, alongside ponds or streams, or even in large containers.



Switch Grass

grass Panicum 'Cheyenne Sky'



Absolutely ideal for growing in decorative containers, this hardy Red Switch Grass is a perennial substitute for Pennisetum 'Rubrum'. Measuring in at just 3ft (2ft before blooming), 'Cheyenne Sky' forms a tight, vaseshaped clump of blue-green foliage that begins turning wine red in early summer. By late summer, nearly the entire clump is drenched in color and is topped by matching wine-red flower panicles held just above the foliage. It makes a dynamite specimen plant and is even more eye-catching when planted en masse.



Fountain Grass

grass Pennisetum a. 'Burgandy Bunny'



Of all the hardy perennial grasses we offer, this is the only miniature variety to show some red color in summer followed by all-over blazing red color in the fall until frost. Everything about this grass is petite, including its short stature, narrow green leaves, and small tufted cream flower plumes in late summer. Use it in containers or the front of the border.



Fountain Grass

grass Pennisetum a. 'Hameln'



2000 MNLA Grower's Choice Award winner! More compact and shorter than the species, 'Hameln' has finely textured leaves that are especially lovely when backlit by the early morning or late afternoon sun.

Soft, greenish-cream colored panicles begin to appear in midsummer, a few weeks earlier than the species. This grass works most effectively in mass plantings, but also can be used as an accent plant in gardens and in containers.



Little Blue Stem

grass Schizachyrium 'Twilight Zone'



Though native Schizachyriums typically color up in fall, the new 'Twilight Zone' possesses a nearly iridescent silvery mauve purple cast all over the whole plant beginning in midsummer. It retains these eerily beautiful tones through fall when brighter purple highlights appear on the flower stems. The attractive foliage forms a strictly upright, narrowly columnar clump that is about half as wide as it is tall.



Prairie Drop Seed

grass Sporobolus Heterolepis



Considered by many to be one of the most refined of all native prairie grasses, Prairie Dropseed has a soft, fountain-like look about it. The green leaves are very narrow, almost threadlike, and grow to form an 18 inch tall clump. It often turns rich shades of gold or deep orange in the fall and then light copper to creamy tan in winter. In late summer, soft pinkish brown flowers are produced atop thin, arching stems held high above the foliage. These panicles are filled with distinctly sweet smelling seeds which smell like ground coriander. Though it produces an abundance of seeds, it is not known to seed invasively in the landscape. This grass is very heat and drought tolerant because it is deep rooted. It is often planted en masse as a groundcover

or as a specimen.

Helleborus 'Wedding Party Mix'



Hellebores are the harbingers of spring, blooming for six weeks or more beginning in late winter. They are often flowering during the Christian season of Lent, from which they get their common name, Lenten Rose.
